SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 **For Hobie Classes:** Each boat entered shall have one member of her crew a member in good standing of the Hobie Class Association.
- 1.3 Rule 40 applies at all times while afloat. This changes the Part 4 preamble.

2 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

- 2.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board(s) located at the Jericho Office

3 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 3.1 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 0900 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect.

4 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on a mast next to the main ramp.
- 4.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 30 minutes' in the race signal AP.

5 SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 5.1 Competitors' Meeting: June 10th, 1100hrs
- 5.2 Dates of racing:

June 10th	1200hrs first warning signal
<i>Date</i>	<i>All Classes</i>
June 11th	1000hrs first warning signal
- 5.3 On the last day of the regatta no warning signal will be made after 1500hrs.

6 CLASS FLAGS

- 6.1 Class Flags will be designated at the Competitors' Meeting.

7 RACING AREAS

- 7.1 The racing area will be on the waters of English Bay off Jericho Sailing Centre

8 THE COURSES

- 8.1 The course will be a standard windward/ leeward course.
- 8.2 Number Pennants will be flown on the committee boat to designate the number of laps. Pennant #2 will signal 1 lap; Pennant #4 will signal 2 laps.
- 8.3 When there is a gate, boats shall sail between the gate marks from the direction of the previous mark and round either gate mark. All other marks will be rounded to port.

9 MARKS

- 9.1 Course Marks will be Yellow. The F18 windward mark will be Orange with a pink ball as an offset.
- 9.2 The port end starting mark will be a staff displaying a red flag. The finish mark will be a staff displaying a blue flag.

10 AREAS THAT ARE OBSTRUCTIONS

- 10.1 A line beginning at the northwest corner of the Royal Vancouver YC Jericho breakwater, through a series of orange and white can buoys ending with the north end of the most westerly pier at Jericho Sailing Centre, delimits an obstruction. Boats may not pass south of this line.
- 10.2 Swimming areas demarked by special purpose buoys along the south shore of English Bay are considered an obstruction.

11 THE START

- 11.1 Races will be started as described in RRS 26, with the warning signal made 3 minutes before the start signals. An Attention signal, consisting of a series of sounds, may be made one minute before the Warning signal.
- 11.2 The starting line will be between the orange flag or shape on the mast of the Committee Boat at the starboard end and the port-end starting mark.
- 11.3 Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting and finishing areas.
- 11.4 A boat starting later than 4 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start. This changes rule A4-2.
- 11.5 After starting properly, boats shall not sail through the Start/Finish line except to finish. A boat breaking this rule shall not correct her error. However, she will be exonerated by completing a one turn Penalty, otherwise she shall be scored DSQ. This changes rule 28.1. The starting and finishing lines and the marks that form it are obstructions for boats subject to this rule and therefore rules 19 and 20 may apply between boats while they are approaching and passing it.

12 THE FINISH

- 12.1 The finishing line will be between the orange flag or shape on the mast of the Committee boat and the finish mark.
- 12.2 When the course is shortened at a gate, a Race Committee boat near the gate will display flag S and boats shall finish by sailing through the gate from the direction of the previous mark. The finish line will be between the gate marks.

13 PENALTY SYSTEM

- 13.1 RRS 44.1 is changed for all classes to one penalty turn that includes one tack and one gybe

14 TIME LIMITS

- 14.1 Time limits are as follows:

<i>Class</i>	<i>Race Time limit</i>	<i>Mark 1 time limit</i>
All Classes	90mins	30mins

If no boat has passed Mark 1 within the Mark 1 time limit the race will be abandoned.

- 14.2 Boats failing to finish within 15 mins after the first boat sails the course and finishes may be scored in their position on the course as determined by the Race Committee without a hearing. This is not open for redress. This changes Rule A4.2 and A5.

15 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 15.1** Protest forms are available at the regatta office. Protests shall be delivered to the regatta office within the protest time limit.
- 15.2** For each class, the protest time limit is 30 minutes after the Race Committee returns to shore. That time will be posted on the Notice Board. [The same time limit applies to protests by the race committee and [protest committee] [jury] about incidents they observe in the racing area and to requests for redress. This changes rules 61.3 and 62.2.]
- 15.3** Notices will be posted within 30 minutes after the protest time limit expires to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held in a designated room in the Jericho building.
- 15.4** Notices of protests by the race committee or [protest committee] will be posted to inform boats under rule 61.1(b).
- 15.5** Breaches of instructions 11.3, 17, 17.2 and 21 will not be grounds for a protest by a boat. This changes rule 60.1(a). Penalties for these breaches may be less than disqualification if the [protest committee] [jury] so decides.
- 15.6** On the last day of the regatta a request for reopening a hearing shall be delivered
- (a) within the protest time limit if the party requesting reopening was informed of the decision on the previous day;
 - (b) no later than 30 minutes after the party requesting reopening was informed of the decision on that day.
- This changes rule 66.
- 15.7** Decisions of the [protest committee] will be final as provided in rule 70.4.

16 SCORING

- 16.1** The Low Point scoring system of Appendix A will apply.
- 16.2** 1 race is required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 16.3**
- (a) When fewer than 4 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
 - (b) When 4 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

17 SAFETY

- 17.1** A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee or an official support boat as soon as possible
- 17.2** Any boat receiving 'hands on' assistance from rescue/mark boats will be scored Did Not Finish. *This changes RRS A5. The Race Committee may decide when a boat or crew needs assistance.*

18 REPLACEMENT OF CREW OR EQUIPMENT

- 18.1** Substitution of competitors will not be allowed without prior written approval of the Race Committee.
- 18.2** Substitution of sails will not be allowed without prior written approval of the Race Committee.

19 EQUIPMENT AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS

A boat or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the class rules and sailing instructions. On the water, a boat can be instructed by a race committee measurer to proceed immediately to a designated area for inspection.

20 OFFICIAL BOATS

The Signal boat will be the JSCA Albatross.

21 RADIO COMMUNICATION

A boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

22 PRIZES

22.1 Prizes will be given to the top 3 finishers in each class over 5 boats. Other classes will receive prizes as decided by the Organization Committee.

23 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

24 INSURANCE

24.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum coverage of \$100,000 per event or the equivalent.
