Jericho Sailing Centre Association September 16 –17, 2023 Vancouver. BC

Notice of Race (NoR)

The notation '[NP]' in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

1 Rules

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS)*, the prescriptions of Sail Canada, the rules of the participating classes, except as any of these are changed by this Notice of Race.
- [DP] RRS 40 and the preamble to Part IV are amended so that competitors shall wear personal flotation devices at all times while on the water except briefly while changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment. Wet suits or dry suits do not qualify as personal flotation devices.

2 Sailing Instructions

2.1 The sailing instructions will be available on or before 1200 hrs on June 2, 2023 at: https://jsca.bc.ca/event/end-of-summer-regatta-2/2023-09-16/ and on the notice board in the foyer of the Jericho Sailing Centre, 1300 Discovery St, Vancouver BC.

3 Communication

 Paper copies of all notices posted on the official notice board will also be posted on the notice board in the foyer of the Jericho Sailing Centre.
- **3.2** [DP] While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

4 Eligibility and Entry

The event is open to ILCA-7, ILCA-6 and ILCA-4; International Fireball; International Tasar; International F18; Hobie 18; RS Quest; Vanguard 15; and Windsurfer. Additional dinghy or catamaran fleets with more than 5 boats may petition the race organizers for inclusion.

- 4.2 To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees.
- 4.3 It is strongly advised that competitors be current members of their provincial and/or national sailing authority.
- All competitors must sign the current member / guest waiver at: https://www.waiverfile.com/b/jsca/Waiver.aspx. Current JSCA members should have signed already. Parents and / or Legal Guardians must sign for under-age sailors.

5 Fees

5.1 Entry fees:

Single handed – \$35 Double handed – \$60

These fees include all racing fees, temporary storage for visiting boats and the regatta meal Saturday September 16. Additional meal tickets can be purchased for \$20. Payment can be made by email money transfer to: accounts@jsca.bc.ca (please include a note with the competitor name and sail number) or in person by cash, cheque or card on the Saturday morning of the regatta.

1000-1200 hrs: last chance to register & pay in person

1200 hrs: skippers meeting

1300 hrs: first signal

1800 hrs (approx): regatta meal in the Burrard Room

1130 hrs: first signal

1530 hrs: last possible warning signal

1630 hrs (approx): results announced ashore

7 Equipment Inspection

- **7.1** Each entrant is responsible that their boat (hull, sails and rigging) conforms with class rules and regulations.
- **7.2** Boats may be inspected at any time.

8 Venue

8.1 The event venue is the Jericho Sailing Centre, 1300 Discovery St, Vancouver, BC.

- **8.2** The racing area is English Bay.
- 9 Courses
- **9.1** Courses will be windard-leeward, triangle or variations thereof. Courses will be specified in detail in the Sailing Instructions.
- **9.2** Marks will be inflatable tetrahedrons.

10 Penalty System

- 10.1 RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty for multi-hull and foiling classes.
- **10.2** RRS 44.2 is in effect for all classes.

11 Scoring

- 11.1 Two (2) races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 11.2 The low point system as described in RRS Appendix A, Section A4 in is effect.
- (a) When fewer than 5 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
 - (b) When from 5 to 9 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
 - (c) When 10 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scrores excluding her 2 worst scores.

12 Risk Statement

- 12.1 RRs 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.
- The organizing authority, the Jericho Sailing Centre Association, its staff and volunteers and sponsors will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with, prior, to, during or after the 2023 End of Summer Regatta.

12.3 It is recommended that competitors carry adequate liability insurance.

13 Rights to Use Names and Likeness

By participating in the End of Summer Regatta, competitors automatically grant to the organizing authority the right, in perpetuity, to make, use, and show, at their discretion, any photography, audio and video recordings, and other reproductions of them made at the venue or on the water from the time of their arrival at the venue, until their final departure, without compensation.
